Night Committee started in 2009 following the break-up of beloved Calgary, AB indie rock band Hot Little Rocket. Andrew Wedderburn and Joel Nye recruited their pal Lorrie Matheson of Fire Engine Red on keys and built a devoted following as one of Calgary's best live acts and most engaging songwriters, fusing 80s American punk and 60s psych-garage. In 2015 Nicola Cavanagh-Whitfield of Cardiograms joined on bass, anchoring the sound.

They've shared the stage with acts like Bob Mould, Hot Snakes, Wares, The Flatliners, and By Divine Right, and released two records, *Crime* (2010) and *Heaven* (2013). After a three-year hiatus from performing, Night Committee returned in power-trio form, with a new set of noisy buzz-saw power-pop. They recorded the new stripped-down songs with Matheson and Josh Gwilliam at OCL Studios and Arch Audio in early 2024. The result, *Your Plans Mean Nothing*, is their most ambitious, direct, and memorable set of songs yet.
